Why be a part of the sounding board?

Commissioning is a partnership and together we can refresh and refine our key guidance materials to ensure they remain relevant and valuable.

What does the sounding board do?

The Roadmap Refresh Sounding Board (Sounding Board) is a maximum of 8 individuals from the community and health sectors.

The Sounding Board will provide feedback on new and refined content and graphics developed to refresh the Roadmap. While not an approval body, the Sounding Board has key perspectives and a critical eye to help shape the content. The refreshed Roadmap will be approved by the Minister.

The Sounding Board will:

- receive draft content for review via email
- review message, language, terminology, graphics
- provide written or verbal feedback to the project team
- meet, if required, to finalise the review process

Who does the Sounding Board report to?

The Sounding Board relates to the project team with responsibility for refreshing the Roadmap. The project team draws resources from both the Community Services Directorate and ACT Health Commissioning teams.

What is the time commitment?

The Sounding Board will/may:

- have three to five days to review draft content in mid-August
- have three to five days to review final content and graphics in late-August/early September
- meet virtually to review final draft early September

Previous experience as a participant in government consultation or a commissioning process.
